

# Garland Coach Declares Team Overconfident

## Owls Heavy Favorite, However, to Cop Title By Beating Carrollton

Overconfidence, that disease often contracted by a football team but never by the coach, has set in at the Garland High School camp—according to Coach Goldie Owens.

"While the boys are undefeated to date and can win the District 14-A title by defeating the Carrollton Lions on our field Friday night, they are too confident for their own good and I wouldn't be surprised to see the Lions beat us," Owens said Thursday.

The game will be played at 7:45 o'clock.

Just last week the Garland eleven whipped the Buckner Orphans Home Hornets, 19 to 0, in a sea of mud to take the lead in the county football race. While the railbirds conceded the Owls' the district championship from the start of the season, Owens has molded such a strong machine that the townfolks are talking about the prospects of the regional title.

The worst case of overconfidence on record could not make the Owls anything but prohibitive favorites to cop the contest with the crippled Lions who have lost four district clashes.

Coach Morris (Fannie) Roach's Carrollton eleven will be minus the services of Ernest Gammon, left halfback, who is out for the season with a leg injury, and James Harrison, a capable right guard, who also is out for the remainder of the schedule with an infected leg.

The morale of the Carrollton team was strengthened somewhat by the return this week of Abe Godfrey who fills the right tackle position. He has been on the injured list for several weeks. Carlisle Lancaster and James Noel, backfield stars, who showed up well against Mesquite last week, are the mainstays of the offense.

Grand Prairie, Buckner Home, Irving and Mesquite are idle this week.
