

Home-Coming Parade Set For Carrollton High Friday

Suburban Carrollton expects 5,000 persons, about one third of them from Dallas, to be on hand at 10 a.m. Friday for a mile-long parade in the gym at 10 p.m. Radio station WFAA's Early Birds will play for the dance.

The parade will open Carrollton High School's nineteenth annual home-coming. It will form at the high school and swing across town for a loop around the town square. In it will be graduates who got their high school diplomas as far back as 1904. At the front of the line will be the Love Field Legion Band and the Carrollton Legion Band. As in former years, there will be at least forty mounted horsemen.

Alumni President Rob Reed said a reunion of all classes is scheduled at the high school auditorium at 2 p.m. Class meetings will be held in Carrollton homes.

Other high lights of a full day's reunion program include the Carrollton-Hillcrest football game at 8 p.m., the annual ex-students dance.
