

Carrollton Lions To Meet Unbeaten Lewisville Team

CARROLLTON, Texas, Nov. 18.—Coach Fanny Roach's Carrollton High Lions, who haven't called time out this season a single time for injuries, will engage the Lewisville Farmers here Wednesday at 7 p.m.

The Lions, who already have broken two jinxes, believe they have a good chance to break another precedent and beat Lewisville for the first time in the history of the annual game.

Earlier in the season the Lions defeated Buckner Home for the first time since the two schools have been playing, and later dumped Garland for the first time in sixteen years.

Carrollton won all but one of its 14-A games, losing only to the champion Mesquite eleven. The Lions have scored 220 points to their foes' 80.

Lewisville is unbeaten in nine games and has piled up 187 points to its opponents' 39.

Twelve players have carried the burden for Carrollton this season and, despite this small list of regulars, the Lions have not had a serious injury all year.

Three of the Carrollton gridgers, Phillip Carver, right guard; James Benningfield, center, and George Roach, quarter, are sons of the Carrollton High School superintendent, principal and coach, respectively.
